Recipe Corner

Simple Apple Cake

Ingredients:

- 2/3 cup canola oil
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 2/3 cups whole-wheat pastry flour
- 1/3 cup flaxmeal
- 2 tablespoons baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons cinnamon
- 1 tablespoon nutmeg
- 4 medium-sized apples, peeled, and diced

Directions:

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees
- Cream together the canola oil and sugar in large mixing bowl
- Add eggs and beat again
- Add all of the remaining ingredients except the apples and blend until combined
- Stir in diced apples by hand
- Spoon into 8x10 inch baking pan and bake 50-60 minutes or until done
